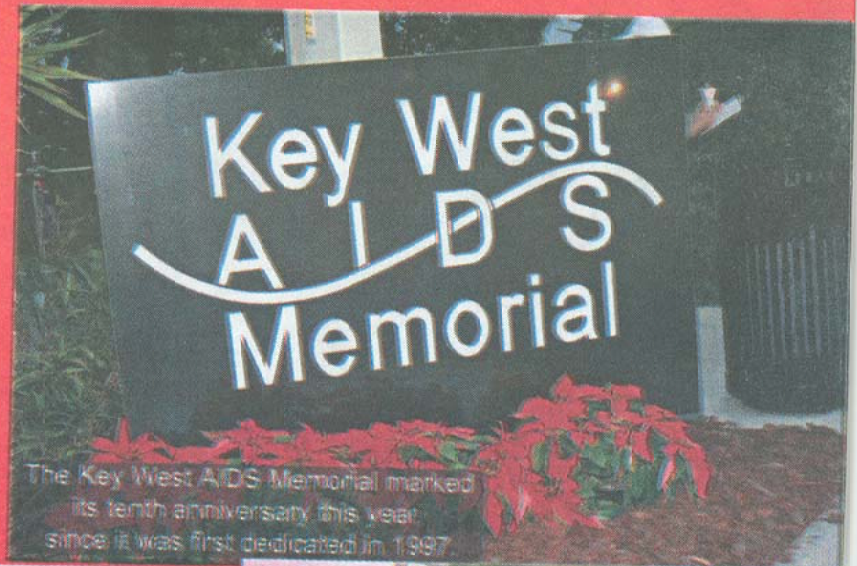


World AIDS Day 2007 Annual Ceremony at Key West AIDS Memorial Honoring Those Fallen

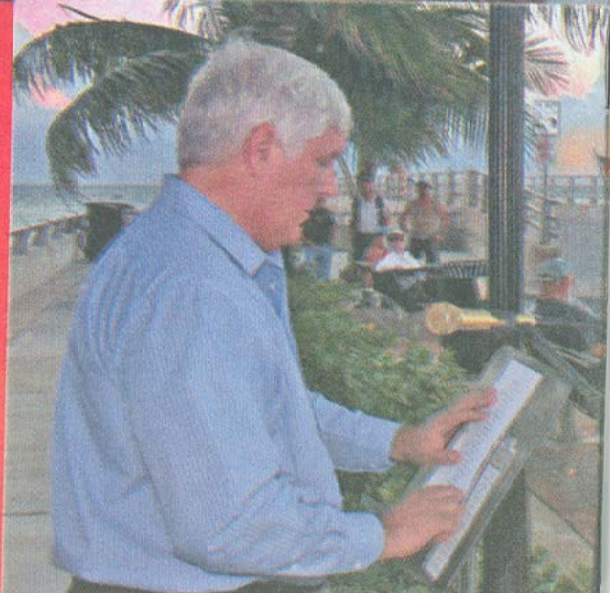


The Key West AIDS Memorial marked its tenth anniversary this year since it was first dedicated in 1997.

State Representative Ron Saunders was among those who read the names of those now memorialized on the AIDS Memorial granite walk.

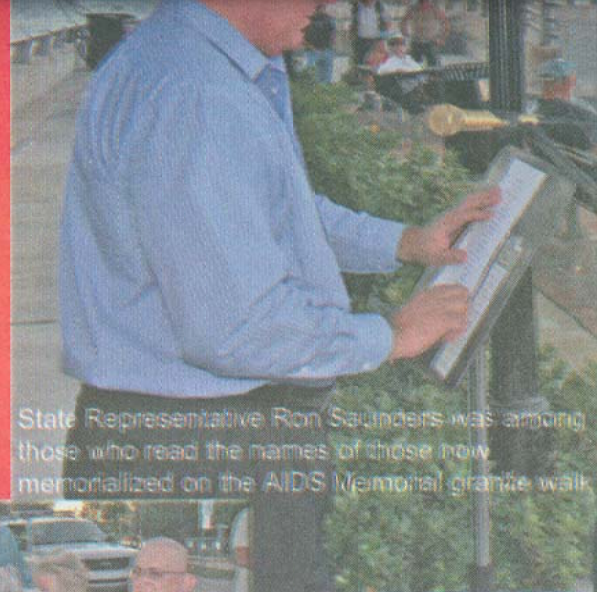

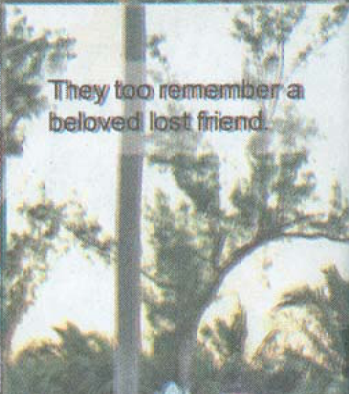
